Position:

UNLVPT is growing and we are adding several new faculty lines to accommodate that growth. These 3 faculty lines are full-time, 9-month positions for Assistant/Associate Professor to be filled within the tenure-track. The successful candidate will be expected to meet University expectations related to research, service and teaching in our DPT program and/or our PhD in Interdisciplinary Health Sciences – Rehabilitation Sciences program. Anticipated start dates are in August 2017 and January 2018.

We envision an excellent scientist-scholar or scientist-practitioner who could thrive in a “very high research activity” environment and who also could help grow the scholarly productivity of the Department. We have identified specific areas of expertise that would be ideal (i.e., cancer rehabilitation, neuroscience, neurologic rehabilitation, genomics, regenerative rehabilitation, cardiopulmonary rehabilitation, geriatrics, pediatrics) but we are more interested in finding individuals whose productivity and potential align with UNLV Top Tier Initiatives rather than specialty area.

Qualifications:

An earned terminal degree (PhD, DSc, or EdD) is required. Candidates with a successful record of scholarly activities (peer-reviewed publications and grants) in rehabilitation sciences are preferred.

Salary:

Competitive salary and excellent start-up package for research.
